The Mountain Maryland Gateway to the West Heritage Area's Mini Grant Program is a matching grant up to \$2,000 designed to provide funding for innovative exhibits, tours, new events, planning and projects which build upon interpretive themes identified in the Heritage Area's Management Plan. These include: Transportation, Man and Nature, Historic Recreation, and Cultural Uniqueness. Projects must seek to attract cultural and heritage tourists to the region. Non-profit organizations and local jurisdictions are eligible. Individuals and businesses with proposals fitting the guidelines may apply in partnership with non-profit organizations. Grants are awarded on a first come, first serve basis until the funding cap has been met. The last available date to accept applications will be Wednesday, March 1, **2017**.
