

### ARC Seeks Partner & Community Input to Guide Investment Priorities

Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) is collecting input via a [public survey](#) to identify critical opportunities and challenges facing Appalachia's economic future for its new strategic plan for fiscal years 2021-2025.

ARC develops a new strategic plan every five years. More than 3,000 Appalachians provided input to develop ARC's current strategic plan, [Investing in Appalachia's Future: The Appalachian Regional Commission's Five-Year Strategic Plan for Capitalizing on Appalachia's Opportunities, 2016-2020](#), which expires on September 30, 2020.

*"As we plan ARC's investment strategy for the years to come, it is important that we be informed by the people we serve,"* said ARC Federal Co-Chairman Tim Thomas.
